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"Have confidence in the Lord with all your heart, and do not depend upon your own prudence.

In all your ways, consider him, and he himself will direct your steps." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

This is a well-known passage that speaks to the importance of trusting in God.

The passage is urging us to have complete trust in God and not rely on our own understanding or knowledge. It is a call to submit our ways to God and to trust in His wisdom and guidance, even if we do not always understand His plans.

"The old error has gone away. You will serve peace: peace, for we have hoped in you. You have trusted in the Lord for all eternity, in the Lord God almighty forever." (Isaiah 26:3-4)

This passage is a reminder of the importance of trusting in God and relying on Him for our peace and security. It promises that those who trust in the Lord with steadfast minds will experience perfect peace, which is a state of tranquillity and contentment that transcends understanding.

"From the height of the day, I will be afraid. But truly, I will hope in you." (Psalm 55:4; 56:4 in others)
